Greetings, GACC Good News Ambassadors,

"What A Day, What A Day, What A Day, Greenville Avenue Ambassadors!" It is time to undertake our second quarter work, focusing on Expanding the Body Through Evangelism. The time has come—well, what do you mean? It is time to expand. Expand what? Expand and grow the church as our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ commanded in Matthew 28:18–20.

- 47 Praising God, and having favour with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved. (As a result of the four pillars mentioned, the Lord's additions to the church occurred daily)

Therefore, let us utilize this quarter to expand the church through EVANGELISM.
